Dr. Matt Farina

Dr. Matt Farina, Civil War enthusiast, will discuss the myth and reality surrounding medicine in Civil War era America. He has given numerous talks around the country emphasizing the grim medical realities of battlefield medicine as well as scientific advances in medicine made during the era.

Dr. Farina is a retired pediatric cardiologist and Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at Albany Medical College. His interest in the Civil War began at the age of ten, and was rekindled while visiting Civil War battlefields with his wife. He is a member of Civil War Roundtables in Albany and Southern Pines, N.C.

Friend of the Library *Remembering Louis Muenkel*

Lou Muenkel was a strong supporter and Friend to the Rosendale Library from the 1950's until his December 2010 death. Lou and his first wife Flo, while raising their five children in Tillson and working as an engineer for IBM, volunteered in many important community activities. One of his favorites was the library.

Lou served many, many years on the Library Board, both as a trustee and an officer. As a tireless and gifted woodworker, Lou was always involved in helping with booths for the multiple Rosendale Library Fairs. He was instrumental in the design of the addition to the library of the children's room and the office in the nineteen seventies. Lou willingly, and successfully, took on the extensive responsibilities of the chairman of the Library Building Fund Committee following the 1977 fire.

While Lou and Flo always personally donated time and money to the library, Lou, as an IBM employee, applied for and was awarded multiple IBM Grants under IBM's Fund for Community Service Program. These grants allowed for the purchase of equipment and furniture - some still in use at the library today.

In 1977, at the rededication of the library after the fire, Lou said, "The beauty of Rosendale is its people." Following in that tradition, Lou's children and his second wife Helen Muller designated the library as the recipient of many generous donations from family and friends in Lou's memory. It is with gratitude that the Friends of the Rosendale Library remember Lou Muenkel as a wonderful, and much missed, Friend of the Library.

From the Desk of

Greetings from the Rosendale Library Board. Now that the roof project is completed, the parking lot is paved and lined and the trenching project appears to be keeping water out of the basement, the Library has turned to other things. We are taking advantage of a program through Central Hudson that will replace existing fluorescent lights with more energy efficient ones. This will be at no cost to the Library. When you get this newsletter, that project will have been completed. The Board has formed a Capital Campaign Exploratory Committee to look at the feasibility of an addition to the Library. At present our 1800 square feet are packed to the maximum. The Committee is composed of three Board members and two members of the Friends of the Library group. The Board hopes to get a preliminary report in a few months.

We have a new board member: Cheryl Craig of Tillson. The Board now has its full complement of nine members. However, on December 31, 2011, the terms of two members will be up and neither is seeking another term. Thus in January, 2012, we will have two vacancies. If anyone is interested in volunteering to serve on the Board, we would ask that you pick up an application form at the circulation desk and return the completed form to the same location. Applicants will be invited to attend a Board meeting to see how it operates. Once accepted the person immediately becomes a member of the Board and must then stand for election on the day of the budget vote in September 2012.

The Library Board has begun the budget process. The Budget and Finance Committee presented the proposed budget to the full Board at the July meeting. Once approved, the budget will be available to the public and our get out the vote campaign will begin. The day of the budget vote is Thursday, September 1st. We hope that the community will show the strong support for the Library that it has always shown in the past.

On Thursday, September 1, 2011, the annual voter referendum on the operating budget for the Rosendale Library and election of Board trustees will take place in the library from 11:00 am to 8:00 pm. Absentee ballots can be obtained at the library prior to September 1st. The proposed 2011-2012 budget will be available for review at the library by mid-August. All registered voters in the Town are eligible to vote and are encouraged to support your library by doing so. The library will remain open on the normal Thursday schedule (11:00 am – 7:30 pm).



To think about as you vote:

Based on information libraries in the Mid-Hudson Library System submitted to New York State in February of 2011:

- Residents of the Hudson Valley made over **4 million visits** to member libraries last year.
- There were more than **2.4 million visits to member library web sites**.
- **50% of residents** in our service area are library card holders.
- Libraries circulated over **4.7 million items**, which is an average of 15 items for every registered borrower.

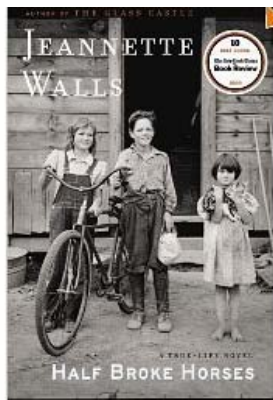
A lively presentation of the local bluestone industry with slides and archival images.

“For the first 10 years of her life, Lily Casey Smith, the narrator of this true-life novel by her granddaughter, Walls, lived in a dirt dugout in west Texas. Walls writes in what she recalls as Lily's plainspoken voice, whose recital provides plenty of drama and suspense as she ricochets from one challenge to another. Having been educated in fits and starts because of her parents' penury, Lily becomes a teacher at age 15 in a remote frontier town she reaches after a solo 28-day ride. Marriage to a bigamist almost saps her spirit, but later she weds a rancher with whom she shares two children and a strain of plucky resilience.

(They sell bootleg liquor during Prohibition, hiding the bottles under a baby's crib.) Lily is a spirited heroine, fiercely outspoken against hypocrisy and prejudice, a rodeo rider and fearless breaker of horses, and a ruthless poker player. Assailed by flash floods, tornados and droughts, Lily never gets far from hardscrabble drudgery in several states—New Mexico, Arizona, Illinois—but hers is one of those heartwarming stories about indomitable women.”**

An altered book is a form of mixed media that changes a book from its original form into a different form, altering its appearance and/or meaning. An altered book artist takes a book (old, new, recycled or multiple) and cuts, tears, glues, folds, paints, adds to, collages, creates pop-ups, rubber-stamps, or be-ribbons it. The artist may add pockets and niches to hold tags, ephemera or other three-dimensional objects. The books and art supplies will be provided by the library but participants are invited to bring their own meaningful objects or photos to personalize their projects.

Practice Tests Database Available

Are you a student planning for college, an adult preparing to take one or more of the most common Civil Service exams, or perhaps a job seeker looking for career exploration tools and resume writing assistance? Through the Mid-Hudson Library System and Rosendale Library, help is now available via HOMEACCESS, also known as the Testing & Education Reference Center.

This database is also a great tool given today's economy. It provides a starting place for people who want to explore a new career, need help with their resume, want to go back to school or get into college. The database includes:

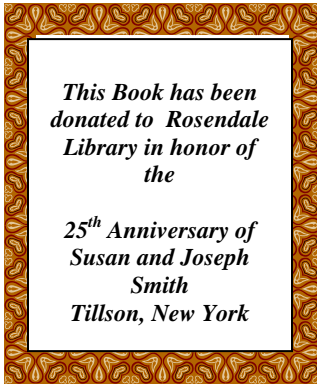

This new program will begin in the fall. After the Book Donation Form is returned to the library, a member of the Friends of the Rosendale Library will contact the donor and also make them aware of the book title when it is available.
